Any work under this contract which is performed on site at the Volpe Center is subject to all provisions of this contract governing the work and the security requirements in place at the Volpe Center. The Contractor shall coordinate compliance with the CO and COTR.

 1. The Contractor is responsible for ensuring that personnel follow the security requirements and regulations of the Volpe Center Safety, Security, and Support Services Office.
 2. The Contractor is responsible for obtaining a copy of the Volpe Center's security requirements/regulations, VNTSC Selected Directive 1600.3, Admittance to Volpe Center Buildings.
 3. All items of Government Property are subject to the Volpe Center's security regulations.
 4. In order to obtain items such as room keys, parking gate keys, and Identification Badges, the Contractor shall:
 - a. Submit a written request for these items of property to the CO and COTR, who will make arrangements with the Volpe Center Safety, Security, and Support Services Office for obtaining these items.
 - b. The Contractor shall submit, within ten (10) calendar days of contract award, a list of its on-site employees to the Volpe CO and COTR. Once the list is submitted, the Contractor will notify the CO and COTR of any staff changes

when they occur and shall update the list of on-site employees every four (4) months thereafter.

- c. When an employee resigns or is terminated or reassigned, the Contractor shall provide written evidence to the CO and COTR of the return of the items of Government Property noted in (4) above. The return of these items of property shall be coordinated with the Volpe Center Safety, Security and Support Services Office.

- **PERFORMANCE OF WORK AND SAFETY PROVISIONS ON GOVERNMENT PREMISES (MAR 2005)**

Any work under this contract that is performed by the contractor or any of its subcontractors on premises that are under control of the Government is subject to the following provisions:

Section C - DESCRIPTION OF WORK

A. Background/Introduction

The Volpe National Transportation Systems Center (Volpe Center) is a research, analysis, and development organization within the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT). As the DOT's national transportation research organization, it serves the Department and other federal agencies needing technical assistance with the transportation and logistics related components of their missions. The Volpe Center, a component of the Research and Information Technology Administration, supports the research, development and operational needs of the Office of the Secretary and provides similar support to other government agencies.

The current security risk in today's work environment requires all government agencies to install all necessary physical security measures with proper security procedures to ensure the safety of all employees within existing budget constraints. The Volpe Center has been in the forefront of installing a new security access system with camera coverage of all access gates and doors including the surrounding grounds. This system requires proper preventative maintenance to ensure optimal utilization. The system also requires an active maintenance agreement to ensure corrective action with minimum delay to prevent any physical security compromise.

The intent of this contract is to acquire a resource capable of performing the requirements specified below.

B. SCOPE

1. DESCRIPTION: The contractor shall provide all labor, equipment, materials and other items or services necessary to perform all operations in connection with the maintenance and repair of the security alarm equipment at the Volpe Center, Cambridge Massachusetts. The installed security alarm systems components are listed in Appendix A.

1.1. The Contractor shall maintain and repair the complete security alarm system as listed in Appendix A, including the card readers, turnstiles, cameras, monitors, recorders, DVR's, computers and all associated equipment necessary to make a complete and usable system to meet all security requirements. Services are to include troubleshooting and replacement of faulty components. Each security alarm system must transmit the alarm signals to the Security Command Center VIA telephone cables, telephone lines and fiber cables.

2. TASKS

2.1 EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE/REPAIR: The contractor is responsible for maintenance of the existing alarm system, the repair of the existing alarm system, and the troubleshooting of the existing system. All site repairs made by the contractor shall be at no cost to the government, unless they are actions that are a direct result of misuse, abuse, government provided data line failure, or natural disaster. If the problem is found to be in the communication lines, the contractor will notify the Contracting Officers Technical Representative (COTR) for this work statement and the Security Desk. The contractor shall be responsible for responding to all service calls, including operation testing and troubleshooting, to determine any problems the system may have. The contractor shall notify the Security Desk and the COTR before proceeding with any testing, maintenance or repair on the alarm system. The contractor shall coordinate work operations with the Security Desk prior to starting and completing each service call. The Security Force will notify the COTR within normal duty hours or the start of the following duty day.

2.1.1 Service Calls: The Contractor shall respond via telephone within one (1) hour of notification by the Government during normal work hours, Monday through Friday, from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. The Contractor shall physically respond during normal business hours to service calls within three (3) hours from the time of notification. Upon arrival at the Volpe Center, the contractor shall physically visit the Security Desk to log in the arrival time. All service calls shall be completed within two (2) calendar days. Once service calls have been completed, the contractor shall notify the Security Desk and the COTR.

2.1.2. The contractor shall contact the Security Desk and the COTR if they will not be able to complete the required work within two (2) calendar days.

2.1.3. Service Slip/ Service Report/or Field Work Order: Upon completion of each service visit, the contractor will furnish the Security Desk or COTR with a service repair slip, Service Report or Field Work Order showing work performed and parts replaced. The slip/work order will be signed and dated by the contractor and countersigned and dated by Security Desk personnel or COTR, if available. The contractor must then supply a copy of the signed service slip/work order to the COTR that day or no later than five working days after completion of work.

2.2. PREVENTATIVE MAINTENANCE: The contractor shall perform preventative maintenance to all components of the security alarm system. This includes operating all listed equipment in Appendix A to ensure proper alignment and operation. The contractor shall provide 16 hours of preventative maintenance per month to ensure all equipment is examined during each two-month period. The contractor shall coordinate the preventive maintenance schedule with the Security Desk and the COTR to aid in facility access. Service shall include operational tests, required adjustments, alignments, programming, and software upgrades. The preventative maintenance work will be recorded in a Contractor provided Security System Testing and Preventative maintenance Logbook. This logbook will ensure all of the equipment is regularly tested as scheduled.

Upon conclusion of preventive maintenance the contractor shall furnish a written report to the Contracting Officer and COTR listing work accomplished and alarm system status.

2.3 PROGRAMMING, TRAINING and REPORTING CONSULTATION: The contractor shall provide 24 hours every six months or in this case 48 hours per base/option period of performance to make adjustments to the security system database fields as directed by the Volpe Security Office including the COTR/ACOTR and to provide training to the security office team to maximize utilization of the database for greater efficiency and report creation. Software upgrades (Lenel) shall be installed under this line item as well.

3.0 WORKING CONDITIONS: The buildings and surrounding site areas will be occupied and Volpe Center operations will continue on a normal, temporary and/or restricted basis. The contractor shall take every precaution to ensure that all contractor operations are conducted in a manner so as not to interfere with the normal operations of the surrounding facilities and the safety and convenience of the occupants. If a portion of the work in this project takes place in a restricted access area, the contractor shall coordinate all activities in the restricted area with the maintenance and security personnel so as to cause as little disruption of normal activities as possible. Other construction contracts may be in progress in some of the facilities covered by this work. The contractor shall coordinate all activities with the COTR and the Contracting Officer so as to have minimum effect on other such contract work.

3.1. The contractor shall start and complete repairs without delay and shall not leave the building unprotected unless communicated and coordinated directly with Volpe Security personnel to include the Senior Guard on watch and the Volpe Security Officer.

3. GOVERNMENT FURNISHED EQUIPMENT AND PROPERTY:

3.1 Normal utilities such as electricity, water, and use of restroom facilities will be furnished for the contractor's use during performance of work in the work statement

4. GENERAL INFORMATION:

4.1. HOURS OF OPERATION. The contractor shall physically respond to service calls and make necessary repairs during normal work hours. Preventive maintenance will be accomplished during normal duty hours: 7:00 AM – 6:00 PM Monday through Friday.

4.2. CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL. The contractor shall identify to the Contracting Officer (CO), a point of contact to identify key personnel and an alternate that have full authority to act on behalf of the contractor on all operational aspects of the contract.

4.2.1 Contractor personnel shall present a neat and professional appearance and be easily recognized as contract employees. This may be accomplished by wearing clothing bearing the name of the company or by wearing appropriate badges, which contain the company's name and employee's name.

4.2.2. The contractor shall ensure that employees possess a current and valid driver's license and current vehicle insurance before operating any type of vehicle or equipment.

4.3. CERTIFICATION OF EMPLOYEES. The contractor shall furnish the Contracting Officer a letter certifying that all those employees who will be performing maintenance and emergency repair work are qualified, experienced technicians in the trade.

4.4. QUALITY CONTROL. The contractor shall use its own internal quality control processes to ensure services are performed in accordance with commonly accepted commercial practices and this SOW.

4.5 PHYSICAL SECURITY. The contractor shall be responsible for safeguarding all government property. The contractor shall establish and implement methods of ensuring that all keys issued to the contractor are not lost, duplicated, or used by unauthorized persons. At the conclusion of each work effort, government facilities, equipment and materials will be secured.

5.0 SECURITY REQUIREMENTS.
